

I'm always amazed by the children who come to the HH, their ability to fit into a new routine,


make new friends and go into the prisons to visit their dad or brother. Many adults find that a daunting task, however the children "seem"

Thankfully, George Rivas knew the Lord and was at peace though his new family did not. (a wedding was here that afternoon... interesting!) The website for Mental Health America notes: "If you lug your elderly neighbor's groceries up her steps, clearly it's good for her. But did you know that it's likely good for you too? Research indicates that those who consistently help other people experience less depression, greater calm, fewer pains and better health. They may even live longer."

Some other findings:

- 1) Students who performed five acts of kindness a day increased their happiness,
- 2) Providing emotional support to others significantly decreased the harmful health effects of certain kinds of stress,
- 3) People who contributed time & money to charity got a boost in a feel-good part of the brain, as revealed in brain imaging research.

Now, these are good reasons to be helpful toward everyone. I often remind myself that there may have been even greater motivation for the early believers. To the Hebrew Christians, Paul said, "Let's think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works." (Heb. 10:24) His motivation was to motivate others to become motivators! Wanna be happy and live longer? Volunteer your time to help others! Wanna do some great Kingdom work? Motivate others to do the same!
